From Jason's Desk

August 2021 was definitely better than August 2020. We had a Little League World Series, and I have to congratulate Little League Baseball and the team of local health care professionals that guided them through the 11 days in getting through it without one Covid issue. Having seen what's occurred at events like the College Baseball World Series, I had some concerns this could affect them as well. However, all went as good as hoped under the second year of the pandemic. Let's hope that this is the last one that we'll have to say this about in looking ahead to the future.

We had a couple of positive announcements that occurred in August related to the local labor market. West Pharmaceuticals announced an expansion of their Williamsport plant that will add 12,000 sq. ft. to their operations. This will add roughly 29 new jobs to the facility with a projected investment by West of over \$18m. The Jersey Shore plant also was involved with this announcement as they are going to be adding another 100 people to address growth there as well. It was good to see this land here in our community as the Williamsport project was being considered at West facilities in two other states. Both the Commonwealth and Lycoming County played a key role in getting this here instead of one of the other locations being considered.

The acquisition of the

former JW Aluminum plant also was announced last month. We were excited to see this occur since this was a very productive business pre-Covid. Unfortunately, the product that was being manufactured there was impacted by the downturn in the production of airplanes which forced this plant, and one in St. Louis, to be shuttered. The plant is now getting restarted under the name of Chance Aluminum, which is owned by AA Metals, with corporate headquarters in Orlando. They intend to quickly restart the operations there with a goal of getting back in operation by October. Additionally, Chance Aluminum is looking to expand their production capacity that will add more employment opportunities there. A key partner in helping to land this project was, once again, the Commonwealth, who was there to provide the company with assistance in their effort to acquire and re-hire many of those that were affected by the January shutdown.

Another announcement that didn't get as much play here locally was the recent acquisition of SK Tools by Shop-Vac's ownership GreatStar Tools USA, which will see that production relocated to Williamsport. This will add to Shop-Vac's manufacturing capacity with a brand that is well known for products that include sockets and drive tools, wrenches, air tools, and other mechanics' tools. While there was fear by some that this was an acquisition to just acquire

the Shop-Vac brand to ship the production overseas, this will hopefully reinforce to the local community that Shop-Vac is back on the right track and its ownership is committed to seeing it grow.

Looking ahead to September, it's good to see all of the plans being made here in the area to recognize the 20th anniversary of September 11. First and foremost, the 9/11 Memorial Ride that emanates from Montgomery at the Clinton Township Fire Hall is occurring, and that is great to have back after a year where they were forced to shut down. It's also wonderful to see that Jersey Shore is doing a candlelight vigil and Loyalsock is doing a 9/11 Heroes Challenge.

To this day, I can still

remember what I was doing 20 years ago when the events of 9/11 occurred. It was the first full day for the Fall Pennsylvania Tourism Conference and it was held in Scranton. I was in the hotel room getting ready for the first conference program and I had the TV on when they shared the news about the crash of an airplane into the Twin Towers. Not realizing what was going to unfold, I went to the first program that had just started and it was interrupted with the news that a second plane had just crashed into the Twin Towers. There was a pause, and a realization that this was not by accident, and we all quickly went to watch the news. At about Noon, the conference was canceled and I raced home to be with

my wife and daughter Lydia who was just over a year old at the time. All of the visuals still haunt me in seeing the towers come down, the people running through the city. Watching the reports of plane crashes in Somerset County and into the Pentagon, it was all surreal at the time.

There were countless moments where you saw valor, bravery and human dignity expressed in the immediate aftermath of these horrible events and the subsequent weeks and months. We rallied together as a nation because in the end, we all are Americans. Twenty years later, that feeling appears to be gone. My hope is that soon we can once again find some common ground to once again be a united people. Because in the end, the lives lost to the tragedies that occurred on 9/11 should be ones that we grow from and never forget.

One of the biggest advantages of using RDF Tax Services is the CPA license Fagnano holds, in addition to the ongoing levels of continued education, including federal, state and local tax laws. Fagnano's schooling is above and beyond any crash course in just federal tax laws.

That may be sufficient in states that start with federal adjusted gross income, however, in Pennsylvania and many other states, people also have to work with state and local taxes.

Preparers who work at national firm branches are not necessarily CPAs. Fagnano is able to catch any errors or omissions, particularly on state and local tax returns that were not prepared by a CPA.

The real kicker? RDF's fees are often comparable or better than those of national firm branches, and you get the expertise of a CPA.

Many of RDF's clients are individuals, and a number of those individuals also own an LLC, a type of business structure that can have a number of owners, including just one person, according to the IRS.

royalties.

Because of the Marcellus Shale industry, Fagnano said that a large number of accountants in the region have had to work with the royalties clients receive from gas drilling on their land — specifically how those royalties factor into taxes.

Those royalties can affect both business owners and individuals, and federal and state guidelines that differ in that area. Some of RDF's clients have gas royalties that are not even from Pennsylvania.

With the near-constant changes to tax laws, some might think that even the best CPAs might have trouble keeping up. Fagnano, however, has a couple tricks up his sleeves.

"I'm required to complete 80 hours of continuing education every two years," he said.

The office also receives tax publications from Washington, including a journal called The Tax Adviser.

The physical structure of RDF Tax Services is infamous in its own right. Fagnano said that the building at 12 N. Washington St., Montoursville, might have been the first built in the borough. It served as the borough building for some time and then as a combined police and fire station.

The basement still holds the old jail cells — minus the bars, though.

RDF Tax Services is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The office can be reached at 570-601-4430.

Accent Lighting Productions: Job is 'rewarding'

There's never a dull moment working in the lighting business between working on stage shows for Stevie Wonder and United States Presidents, to lighting local hospitals, colleges, weddings and parties.

From "backyards to ballrooms" Jeff and Shannon Millay, owners and operators of Accent Lighting Productions, do it all.

"My friend got me into it (lighting)," Jeff Millay said. "He was a guitar prodigy who was the guitarist for Stevie Wonder when we were 17 or 18...One day their lighting guy called off and my friend got me in."

Before starting his business in 2007, he worked in Philadelphia lighting the night clubs, but soon after was hired by a company that tours with different acts across the country. That is where he got to work with Tony Bennett, The Goo Goo Dolls and even lit the stages for both Presidents Bush and Clinton.

"I have worked for 50 to 60 national acts," he said. "...Just being able to meet with a lot of celebrities; they were just like you and I. It was nice to interact with them."

In addition to that work, Millay also works closely with the local area to light Lycoming College, events at Penn College and do specialty lighting for annual events and charities.

In October, the Millays also helped light the outside of six of UPMC hospitals pink for breast cancer awareness and in the spring, he helps light Lycoming College for Autism awareness.

This will also be the fifth or sixth year that Accent Lighting Productions will be doing the laser show at the end of the Hughesville Rotary Club Balloon Fest.

"We have done pretty much every venue in town," Jeff Millay said.

They have also helped light a home behind the Loyalsock Township High School football field, what Jeff called "Friday Night Lights at the Sock Deck."

He added that he lights the deck in different colors depending on the type of game with Loyalsock Township images like the Lancer. The deck has also been lit to support other local sports teams.

When the pandemic initially hit, there was a struggle for the business having lost all business for roughly nine months before outdoor events were able to be held again.

Though Jeff Millay said that the business is "not back to where they used to be"

he is hopeful that more events are able to be held this year between the colleges, weddings and parties.

"I look at it as an art form," Jeff Millay said. "Besides it being very rewarding artistically, being able to exceed customers expectations...to meet with someone you try and describe it and show them pictures but when they see it in real life they are totally blown away."

"From lighting a local family's birthday party at 16 to having them come back at 24 for their wedding," he said, some of his favorite memories include the ongoing relationship with the customers.

Kutzas Kitchen a local favorite for sit down, take out, catering

Kutzas Kitchen in Jersey Shore is a community favorite for American style food. Located at 318 Wilson St. in Jersey Shore, the family-owned business offers meals for sit down and take out, as well as catering for events.

The restaurant opened for business in 2016, and has since expanded its menu and catering services.

"A lot of our customers aren't customers, they're family. They've become family over the last five years. We went from someone they get food from, to people who are like family. It's a huge gift to us," said Crystal Kutza.

The owner, Christopher Kutza, is a native of the Jersey Shore area and a graduate from Jersey Shore High School. He runs the operation with help from Crystal Kutza, his mother.

"I enjoy the customers, I really enjoy it. ...I love what we do. ...This opportunity came about. It's something my mom always wanted to do, too — She helps me out," said Chrisopher Kutza.

"I've always shown how I care about people with cooking, whether it be my kids, my grandkids, that's how I show them that I care, through cooking," she said.

The pair enjoy working together as a family-owned business.

"It's the best because they know what to expect from you. You know what to expect from them. We make each other happy, doing what we love," she said.

The restaurant serves a selection of sandwiches, specialty burgers, cheesesteaks, cosmos, daily specials, weekly desserts, appetizers and more.

"Christopher wanted it to be stuff he grew up on, our specials are homemade food that he grew up on. He always wanted to make sure no one left here hungry. They're going to know they ate when they came here," she said.

"We've had chicken gravy over stuffing, cheese filled shells, meatballs, we do meatball subs as a special, stuff like that. ...We started expanding into burgers. We have specialty burgers now. We use my smoked cheese on some of them," he said.

During the pandemic when local schools were shut down, Kutzas Kitchen teamed up with the local YMCA and other community members to make sure the kids who were missing school had food to eat.

"The kids looked forward to it — To get out, and not be stuck in the house. It's something that we are all proud of," she said.

During this time, the restaurant fed around 100 kids every week day.

"We did that with the community, YMCA, parents, grandparents. We worked together. People don't realize how many children go without food," she said.

Daily specials and desserts are often shared to Kutzas Kitchen Facebook page.

Some of the foods that have been available for catering include potato salad, sweet and sour pasta salad, fruit trays, homemade mac and cheese, barbecue pulled pork, Mississippi pot roast and more.

The restaurant has recently expanded its catering services to larger events, such as large parties and weddings.

"We just got into bigger events, weddings. ...Any normal stuff that people need catered. ...Family reunions, surprise birthday parties. ...We do a lot of catering," he said.
